2025 Grants Program open

Long-standing Chair retires

Volunteers are the backbone of many local organisations, but it is not always easy to find people willing to dedicate personal time and energies to helping others. From sponsoring local sports clubs, helping with big capital projects like the Men's Shed, through to assisting in wellbeing services - there is a huge range of grants funded each year - 58 alone in 2024.

Rob also frequently represented the bank at events and functions – taking the opportunity to spread the word that when locals choose to bank with Community Bank Epping, their support helps others.

Community Sports help


The bank has a long history of helping local sports clubs with a whole range of projects and sponsorship. Epping is lucky to have a great range of sporting options within easy distance but all clubs rely on the hard work of volunteers, and try to keep costs down especially for families. In 2024, we helped with 13 sports club projects. Recent ones include:

- St Gerards Netball Club: Annual sponsorship has helped cover recurrent club costs for this friendly local club.
- Tigers Baseball Club: Whilst based in Ermington, this is a club accessed by Epping residents looking for a summer-time sport.
- Roselea Football Club: They applied for funding for a new trailer (photo right). Every week gear has to be transported between grounds for training and games – and will be made much more efficient with the trailer.
